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
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2019-2020 ANNUAL REPORT Potomac Health Foundation made grants in 2019-2020 through the Howard L. Greenhouse Large Grant Program in the areas of access to health care, mental health, and capacity building. Grants were also made to health safety net organizations providing direct clinical or pharmaceutical services to low income, un/under-insured individuals in the community.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had devastating effects in our community, with certain communities in the PHF service area being some of the worst hit in the Commonwealth of Virginia in terms of number of COVID-19 cases. The pandemic has also highlighted existing inequities for low income individuals and people of color who have especially borne the brunt of the pandemic. They are especially vulnerable because of greater exposure to the virus, lower access to health care, and economic challenges.

PHF responded to the pandemic in our role as a funding partner by not disrupting funding to grantees because of any change in programming. PHF also converted all continuation grants to general operating support. PHF made additional COVID-19 response general operating grants to organizations providing direct services to community members, as well as to a regional pooled COVID-19 emergency response fund. In the early stages of the pandemic, PHF also continued to virtually convene partners providing health care and mental health services to keep organizations connected and aware of what resources were available in the community.

Through this time, community partners have shown their resiliency and their ability to adapt in difficult times. Many quickly pivoted to providing telehealth primary care and behavioral health care. Others moved their programming or services to virtual platforms or took careful measures to implement safe public health practices. PHF commits to continuing to support the efforts of our partners during these times.
